Assessment of Learning—Curriculum

Assessment for learning is any assessment for which the first priority in its design is to promote student learning. Formative assessment plays a particularly important function in assessment for learning. Why is it Important? Assessment for learning focuses on the opportunities to develop students' ability to evaluate themselves, to make judgements about their own performance and improve upon it. In other words, it helps to develop student assessment literacy.

Assessment for Learning—Curriculum Framework

"Assessment which is explicitly designed to promote learning is the single most powerful tool we have for both raising standards and empowering lifelong learners." (Beyond the Black Box, Assessment Reform Group, 1999) In 2004, a major Assessment for Learning (AFL) project titled the AFL Action Research Project began in 25 primary schools.

The teacher uses that information to plan learning experiences based on appropriate objectives from the curriculum, and on the child's previous learning: Through assessment the teacher constructs a comprehensive picture of the short-term and long-term needs of the child and plans future work accordingly (Primary School Curriculum, Introduction, p. 17).
