How to Teach English Listening Skills. Teaching English listening skills successfully requires using a combination of different resources to expose your students to spoken English. The lessons can be stimulating, as you can use films, music, radio and language-learning CDs to improve their skills. Translating spoken English is challenging as the words cannot be read, and there are no accompanying pictures or gestures to help the students understand.

Specifically in teaching listening comprehension, Podcasts also used as primary sources and review tools in EFL classrooms. A study conducted by Ashraf, Naroozi and Salam (2011) demonstrated that podcast has significant impact on Iranian EFL sophomore students' listening comprehension.
